## Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Cranborne CE First School and Nursery, over a number of years we have provided the following;

- Opportunities for children to participate in football, netball, rounders and rugby events and competitions in our Priory Hub
- Increased opportunities for children to engage in extra-curricular clubs to develop skills and broaden children's experiences.
- Developed resources to promote physical development in EYFS with the extension of our age range and addition of nursery
